

VICTIM SERVICES

All services are provided free of charge

24-Hour Crisis Line: CADV offers the only 24-hour crisis line in Elko, White Pine, and Eureka counties.

Crisis Intervention: Victims, their families, and other agencies can request and receive assistance during a crisis by contacting the 24-hour hotline.

Shelter: Harbor House provides a safe, homelike atmosphere for victims and their children. Shelter is free of charge and all basic necessities are available on-site.

Harbor House is the only domestic violence shelter in Northeastern Nevada.

Victim Advocacy: Advocates provide respectful inquiry, active listening, and a willingness to act. Advocates are trained on community resources, requirements, and implementation. They assess each victim's needs and offer appropriate referrals to community resources. CADV advocates assist victims when accessing state and federal victim programs (including victim notification, victim's compensation, confidential address program, and battered immigrant woman status).

Peer Counseling: Within a safe, fair and confidential environment victims can speak freely with a non-professional staff member. Peer counseling offers (a) emotional support (esteem, attachment, and reassurance), (b) instrumental support (material goods and services), (c) companionship and (d) information support (advice, guidance, and feedback).

Recovery Program: CADV facilitates a weekly recovery group for victims. Victims discuss what has happened to them, express emotions, heal, learn, identify goals, and develop survival skills necessary for managing life's transitions in everyday society.

Legal Advocacy: CADV provides legal and court advocacy to victims, including temporary protection order (TPO) assistance. Advocates accompany victims as they maneuver the judicial system. (CADV has no attorneys on staff and cannot give legal advice.)

How You Can Help

Volunteer

Volunteers are needed for every aspect of the organization. Volunteer opportunities include crisis line, office help, maintenance, board of directors, and fundraising.

Donate

CADV accepts a variety of community donations. Ongoing community support can include cash donations, employee payroll deductions, bequests, and wish list items. A current wish list can be found on CADV's website.

Adopt-a-Family

Sponsors can adopt a family for the holidays or like the Lamoille Women's Club, for the entire year.

Support Fundraisers
